On November 4, 2014 a separate question will be on the ballot asking for your support of our children.



The question will be stated as such:

"In addition to the regular budget, the Board of Education will seek approval from the district's legal voters to raise an additional \$360,000 for field trips, after school extracurricular activies, school sponsored athletics, restoration of fulltime Spanish, Art, Music, Basic Skills and English as a Second Language positions and purchase of computers. The taxes, if raised, will be used exclusively for these purposes. Approval of these taxes will result in a permanent increase in the district's tax levy. The proposed additional expenditures are in addition to those necessary to achieve the Core Curriculum Content Standards."

Many senior citizens qualify for the property tax reimbursement program. Therefore, any increase related to the approval of the question will be reimbursed to them by the State of New Jersey.
